


Klamath River Promise Neighborhood Klamath, CA

Community Composition



The mouth of Klamath River is located on the Yurok Reservation (seat of the Yurok Tribe) in Del Norte County, California, which gives the Klamath River Promise Neighborhood (KRPN) its name. KRPN brings together cross-sector partners, including tribes, schools, the Del Norte Unified School District and County Office of Education, community-based organizations, institutes of higher education, local government, and family and resident groups. Together with these partners, KRPN intends to improve educational, health, and developmental outcomes for children by building a continuum of solutions centered around community-driven schools in Del Norte County and adjacent Tribal Lands. KRPN is the sixth member of the California Promise Network.

Select Strategies

- The Transition to Kindergarten Programs provide a bridge program to help families and children prepare for kindergarten.
- Wonder Bus provides children ages O-12 with programs and reading opportunities on wheels.
- Incredible Years Social-Emotional Learning Program strengthens the social-emotional skills of children aged 3 months to 5 years.
- The Indigenous Education Advocacy Project creates school climates that respect and honor Native students, traditions, and communities.
- Attendance specialists help children who are chronically absent catch up on missed work.
- Youth and family advocates provide support before and during the first year of college for first generation students. Advocates help students to develop a Life Plan, and progress toward academic and personal goals.
- Expanded career and technical education programs continue to support students in acquiring important life skills.
- Promotoras (neighborhood resident leaders) are trained to assist parents in understanding and accessing available supports.
- Family Resource centers staffed by Promotoras provide a variety of family strengthening and support services.
