Delta Health Alliance's Leflore Promise Community (LPC) is a community-based collaborative established to implement a seamless continuum of evidence-based programs. LPC's cradle-to-career pipeline of programs aims to improve the lives of children, youth, and families in rural Leflore County in the Mississippi Delta. Delta Health Alliance and partners work together to improve school readiness, academic achievement, and career/college preparation for Greenwood Leflore Consolidated School District students. In addition, LPC creates leadership opportunities, invests in local economies, and provides much-needed health and social supports for families in the community. LPC uses the School Transformation Model plus a pipeline of 28 evidence-based programs.

Innovative Strategy Spotlight

LPC's multisector leadership team trained in Results-Based Leadership with the Annie E. Casev Foundation. The team embeds the principles of this goal-oriented framework into all Delta Health Alliance initiatives, processes, and campaigns. This framework helps the Leflore team focus its efforts and resources to better serve the most underrepresented populations while sustaining practices that will achieve population-level results beyond the grantee's federal funding. The team's ability to collect, analyze, and communicate data has helped accelerate the rate at which LPC can turn the curve on meaningful population-level indicators of academic, family, and community success. This experience also helped LPC understand which efforts are essential to launch a complex project like Promise Neighborhoods.
